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OVERVIEW

In the next few pages, I include a summary of my quantitative and qualitative student evaluations. For the quantitative evaluations, I provide data on courses from the last three years. I've organized the data by course and distinguish average scores for Overall Class Rating from scores for Overall Instructor Rating. Where available, I've included both raw and adjusted scores. Adjusted scores consider student reports on the following prompts: "student desire to take the course regardless of who taught it," "student work habits," "instructor reported class size," "student effort not attributable to the instructor and course difficulty," and "course difficulty not attributable to the instructor." I also include all qualitative comments from a few recent courses taught at Loyola University Chicago. In the final two pages are letters from former students who describe their experience with me and my impact on them.
